- Library Orientation Lesson

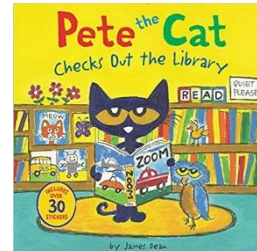

**Text-to-Text Connections:** *Library Behavior/Imagination*
